#### THE ROSARY



The rosary is one of the most cherished prayers of our Catholic Church.

The origin of the rosary is unknown. The use of "prayer beads" and the repeated recitation of prayers to aid in meditation stem from the earliest days of the Church. In the Middle Ages that strings of beads were used to count Our Father's and Hail Mary's. The structure of the rosary evolved between the 12th and 15th centuries. Eventually 50 Hail Mary's were recited and linked with verses of psalms or other phrases evoking the lives of Jesus and Mary. This form of prayer became known as the rosarian ("rose garden) During the 16th century, the structure of the five-decade rosary was based on the three sets of mysteries prevailed.

The rosary gained great popularity in the 1500s. In 1571, Pope Pius V asked all of the faithful to say the rosary and implore our Blessed Mother that our Lord would grant victory to the Christians as they fought the Moslem Turks who were ravaging Eastern Europe. The Moslems were defeated and Pope St. Pius V established October 7 as the Feast of the Holy Rosary.

The Church continues to include the Feast of the Holy Rosary on the liturgical calendar as a testimony to the importance and goodness of this form of prayer. Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the rosary is beyond description."
